**Tuesday, 10/6/15 – Post Event Review**

1. The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. in Borough Chambers.
2. Minutes of the meeting from 9/1/15 were approved by unanimous consent.
3. Ms. Stuski thanked Coach and Good Shepherd volunteers for their help with the event. Coach reported that the football team made a small excess of funds to support their programs. They have used these and other funds raised to underwrite renovations to the concession stand (which they use), paint for the stands, and the purchase and installation of three cooler units.
4. The placement of the fence around Redding Field was discussed. It will remain up after the event to facilitate foot traffic at the football games.
5. It was reported that the parade went well, starting and ending on time with no incidents.
6. The Chair expressed appreciation to individual members, who worked for months to prepare. The various dignitaries who attended (including Congressman Perry, Senator Vance, Representative Delozier, and Cumberland County Commissioners Jim Hertzler and Gary Eichelberger) received thank you notes, emails and personal calls to acknowledge their attendance. Remarks flowed well, and the Redding family expressed appreciation for allowing them to unveil the new commemorative sign.
7. Mrs. Grugan reported that sales of books and branded merchandise generated nearly \$1,000.
8. A few 200<sup>th</sup> Anniversary posters remain and are available at the Borough Office for \$5 each.
9. The winner of the last large pottery crock is a resident who has lived in the community for more than 60 years. Ms. Stuski hand-delivered it.
10. Children's games facilitated by the Girls Scout Troop went well. Winners received prize tickets and were able to pick from a supply of prizes, which allowed the kids to really enjoy the games.
11. The magician was unable to attend. He will be rescheduled for another event.
12. Cake and cupcakes were good quality and many people remarked on how good they were. A small quantity remained, so estimated attendance was pretty close to expectations.
13. The various historians, especially the Civil War canon battery and flint-napper, were very well received with many visitors and interactions with guests.
14. The fifth-generation Wormley family members, who came from out of state to attend, were very complimentary and appreciated the number of people who spoke to them and made an effort to make them welcome. Mrs. Grugan plans to remain in communications with them.
15. Coverage from *The Sentinel* was good. Several photos were posted on social media. People took photographs and were asked to email them to the Borough Office.
16. It was agreed that, in general, the event went well and was a success.
17. Decision about other wrap-up and what to do next year will be transitioned to the Recreation Board for consideration and recommendations.
18. The meeting adjourned at 7:30 p.m.
