The regular meeting of the Wormleysburg Borough Council was held on April 11, 2017, in Council Chambers. The meeting was called to order by Council President Thomas Martini at 7:30 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Mr. Hawbecker.

Mr. Martini requested that all speakers and Councilpersons speak into the microphones speak clearly and speak up so everyone in the room can hear you.

**APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

A Motion by Mr. Deklinski, second by Mrs. Stuart: to approve the Minutes of the March 15, 2017 meeting, as presented. The Motion carried.

**APPROVAL OF AGENDA**

The Agenda was accepted with Mr. Kahler bringing up for discussion an Ordinance governing excessive noise. Recently, he was forced to contact the police regarding loud, profanity laced, unacceptable music being played at the Rupley Park near his house. There were 20-25 small kids there. The officer who responded advised him that the borough had no noise ordinance and nothing could be done. The loud music did stop when the officer arrived. After a long discussion it was determined that the borough's ordinances would be sufficient to stop it if it happens again and the offenders could have been cited for disorderly conduct. Chief Hope will increase park checks with the officers.

**BOROUGH MANAGER REPORT**

- a. Mr. Berresford noted that East Pennsboro will cease covering the sanitary sewer operation with its licensed operator on June 1, 2017. As a way of thanking East Pennsboro, we can offer reciprocation of our borough resources if they ever need assistance. He reported that Dave Spiroff will be taking the test on April 24<sup>th</sup> for the wastewater license. Should he fail, he can take the test a total of five times.

**TREASURER**

- a. A Motion by Mr. Deklinski, second by Ms. Stuski: to accept the Treasurer Report for March 2017 and file for audit. The Motion carried.
- b. Mr. Berresford noted that the audit for 2016 has been completed.

**SOLICITOR**

- a. There was no report.

**COUNCIL PRESIDENT'S REPORT**

- a. Recognition for the police officers will be next month.

**MAYOR'S REPORT**

- a. The Mayor reviewed the March 2017 West Shore Regional Police Incident Report and there were no questions.
- b. Mayor Preble reported that the YMCA will once again run its Marathon and Half-Marathon through Wormleysburg and he requested approval from council to close the roads on the dates of the races. The Half-Marathon will run September 10 at 8:00 a.m. and the Marathon will run November 12 at 8:00 a.m. A Motion by Ms. Stuski, second Mr. Stumpf: to approve the dates for the closing of the roads for the Harrisburg Marathon and Half-Marathon. The Motion Carried. Mr. Tom Gifford of the YMCA will obtain all the permits from PENNDOT.

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**PLANNING COMMISSION**

- a. There was no report.

**BUILDING, PROPERTY & AUXILIARY SERVICE**

- a. There was no report.

**ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE**

- a. A Motion by Mr. Hawbecker, second by Mr. Deklinski: to pay the 2 Payroll checks for 2017 totaling \$410.00. The Motion carried.

A Motion by Mr. Hawbecker, second by Mrs. Stuart: to pay the 2017 General Fund bills, 43 checks totaling \$233,364.36. The Motion carried.

A Motion by Mr. Hawbecker, second by Mr. Deklinski: to pay the 2017 Sewer Revenue Fund bills, 8 checks totaling \$128,503.62. The Motion carried.

A Motion by Mr. Hawbecker, second by Mr. Deklinski: to pay one check from the Fire Tax account for \$17,140.00. The Motion carried.

- b. A Motion by Mr. Hawbecker, second by Mr. Deklinski: to approve the revisions to the Snow Emergency Ordinance. The Motion carried.

**PARKS, PUBLIC LANDS, RECREATION**

- a. Ms. Stuski reported the Easter Egg Hunt went off well and a lot of children participated.

b. The CapCOG meeting was held March 30<sup>th</sup> and the barriers for Interstate 81 were discussed with PENNDOT. There was also a presentation on Neighborhood Dispute Conflict Resolution and offered is a youth program, landlord/tenant, custody issues, and family mediation, and trained mediators are used.

- c. On April 17 there will be a meeting to determine if a fire safety coordinator is needed by COG for all fire companies.

d. Mr. Deklinski brought up that New Cumberland baseball is interested in the baseball equipment that we want to get rid of from Redding Park. Ms. Stuski stated that it is okay for him to contact New Cumberland and have them take it.

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**STREETS, HIGHWAYS, SANITARY AFFAIRS**

- a. Mr. Deklinski reported that there will be a pre-bid meeting in April for the street work bids to be opened in May.
- b. The Borough has until June to decide on options for the MS4. More information may be needed to use alternate options the Borough has available.
- c. The Engineer will be here for a meeting on April 25<sup>th</sup> and options for the MS4 can be discussed with them at that time.

**ZONING & CODES ENFORCEMENT**

- a. The P.R.I.N.T. map and newsletter finally was mailed out.

**PUBLIC SAFETY**

- a. A Motion by Mr. Stumpf, second by Mr. Deklinski: to accept the West Shore Bureau of Fire Incident Report for March 2017. The Motion carried.
- b. A State grant for \$13,545 for equipment purchases was received by the fire bureau.

**NEW BUSINESS**

- a. Mr. Stumpf reported that Mrs. Hergenroeder has asked to improve the Borough website that is lacking in its ability to be user friendly. Both Ms. Stuski and Mrs. Stuart thinks more people should be able to get involved. The current program being used is out of date and has limitations; Mr. Berresford did bring up that a new website will come with a higher price. After some discussion, council authorized Mr. Berresford to check into what Mrs. Hergenroeder has offered.
- b. Mr. Deklinski reported that the Fredricksen Library has a Community bin for information that the borough would like to distribute to its citizens.

Being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:13 p.m.
