COUNCIL MINUTES**

The regular meeting of the Wormleysburg Borough Council was held on June 14, 2016, in Council Chambers. The meeting was called to order by Council President Thomas Martini at 7:30 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Mrs. Stuart.

Also present was Mrs. Godfrey, Secretary. Mr. Berresford, Borough Manager, Secretary and Treasurer and G. Bryan Salzmann, Borough Solicitor, were absent.

Mr. Martini requested that all speakers and Councilpersons speak into the microphones speak clearly and speak up so everyone in the room can hear you.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A Motion by Mr. Deklinski, second by Mrs. Stuart: to approve the Minutes of the May 10, 2016 meeting, as presented. The Motion carried.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Item number two on the agenda was tabled and the agenda was accepted.

CITIZENS

a. Bill Weigle, 302 N. Front Street, brought up a complaint about the removal of the Founders Day banners that were mounted around town. He was the main impetus on this project, selling them to sponsors and planning where they should be mounted. It was the original idea that they would remain up as long as they lasted, about five years. He is very upset that they were taken down. Mr. Martini and Mr. Deklinski had no recollection that they were to stay

- a. up indefinitely and were not aware that taking them down was a problem. Once the Borough Manager returns, they will talk to him about it. Mr. Deklinski suggested putting them back up.**
- b. Chief Hope reported that \$33,000.00 has been raised for the K-9 project and it has been approved by the Police Commission to proceed with it. They found a used K-9 vehicle for \$2,000.00 and hope to have an officer in the September K-9 class and maybe be in service in October.**

BOROUGH MANAGER REPORT

- a. There were no questions.**

TREASURER

- a. A Motion by Mr. Hawbecker second by Ms. Stuski: to accept the Treasurer Report for May 2016 and file for audit. The Motion carried.**

SOLICITOR

- a. There was no report.**

COUNCIL PRESIDENT'S REPORT

- a. Mr. Martini reported that a resident of Waterford Condominium approached him and asked if the Borough would place a dumpster on their premises to be used for recycling materials only. Their condo association does not provide recycling, only trash dumpsters. After some discussion and review of the various options, Borough Council determined that the resident should look to the condo association to have a dumpster placed there for recycling.**

MAYOR'S REPORT

- a. Mayor Preble reviewed the Police Report and there were no questions.**
- b. Mr. Deklinski requested that more police patrols take place at Redding Park because there is activity there after dark.**

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Mayor's report continued.

c. Mr. Stumpf thanked the police for the speed timer that has been moved all over town. Mr. Hawbecker was also appreciative of the walking patrols in town.

PLANNING COMMISSION

a. There was no report.

BUILDING, PROPERTY & AUXILIARY SERVICE

a. Mr. Kahler had no report.

ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE

a. A Motion by Mr. Hawbecker, second by Ms. Stuski: to pay the 2016 General Fund bills, 45 checks totaling \$61,923.35. The Motion carried

A Motion by Mr. Hawbecker, second by Mr. Deklinski: to pay the 3 Payroll checks totaling \$615.00. The Motion carried.

A Motion by Mr. Hawbecker, second by Mrs. Stuart: to pay the 2016 Sewer Revenue Fund bills, 20 checks totaling \$78,374.08. The Motion carried.

PARKS, PUBLIC LANDS, RECREATION

a. Ms. Stuski reported that the Riverfront committee met and made some revisions to the Ordinance and also are working on a new form for registering boats. The new Ordinance will spell out violations.

b. There was no Recreation Board quorum.

c. The C.O.G. will be having on August 15 at H.A.C.C. a Firefighter's Forum. Many representatives will be attending. It will run from 6:00 to 9:00 p.m.

d. Ms. Stuski noted that a video game focused for junior fire fighters would be a good way to get volunteers interested.

e. The PSAB Conference had a focus on getting more volunteer fire fighters also. Some places were offering stipends but that must be shut down because then they are viewed as employees. PSAB is pushing for scholarships for volunteer fire fighters and any other ideas.

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Parks/Public lands/Recreation continued

f. Mr. Deklinski brought up the Length of Service Awards program for volunteer fire fighters. It is offered through insurance companies that cater to fire fighters. It is cost prohibitive but maybe a hybrid program could be worked out.

STREETS, HIGHWAYS, SANITARY AFFAIRS

a. A Motion by Mr. Deklinski, second by Mrs. Stuart: to award the 2016 Streets Project to Hempt Brothers, the low bidder, at a cost of \$90,948.00. The Motion carried. The bids were opened on June 9 and there were three bidders. The engineer reviewed the bid documents and approved the bid was complete.

b. The work crew has been fixing potholes, clearing inlets, cutting grass and staying ahead of their workload.

ZONING & CODES ENFORCEMENT

a. There was no report.

PUBLIC SAFETY

a. Another meeting will be held to discuss financing the new fire house and Request for proposals will be sent out to five financial institutions.

b. It appears that a new fire truck apparatus will be needed toward the end of the year. Mr. Stumpf noted that he hopes to get that financing bundled along with the fire house funding.

c. The Fire Commission will be holding Smoke in the Park again this year on September 23, 24 in Memorial Park, in Lemoyne.

OLD BUSINESS

a. Mayor Preble brought up that National Night Out would probably be using the Knisley Hall kitchen and questioned its condition. Mr. Kahler stated that it still needs cleaned, however it is better than it was. After some discussion it was decided to have the Borough Manager get a price from the current janitorial service to thoroughly clean, maybe steam clean, the kitchen. It was also brought up that the Manager should have the current insurance carrier

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Old Business continued.

a. inspect the kitchen facility and do a Loss Control report. The ice machine was brought up several times as needing to be removed as was the leaking fryer.

At this time, 8:09 p.m. being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
