

**WORMLEYSBURG BOROUGH
COUNCIL MINUTES**

The rescheduled regular meeting of the Wormleysburg Borough Council was held on March 15, 2017, in Council Chambers. It had been rescheduled due to a snow storm. The meeting was called to order by Council President Thomas Martini at 2:00 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Mayor Preble.

Mr. Martini requested that all speakers and Councilpersons speak into the microphones speak clearly and speak up so everyone in the room can hear you.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A Motion by Mr. Deklinski, second by Mr. Stumpf: to approve the Minutes of the February 14, 2017 meeting, as presented. The Motion carried.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

The Agenda was accepted as presented.

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CITIZENS

BOROUGH MANAGER REPORT

- a. There were no questions.

TREASURER

- a. A Motion by Ms. Stuski, second by Mr. Deklinski: to accept the Treasurer Report for February 2017 and file for audit. The Motion carried. Mr. Berresford noted the General Fund checking amount is not accurate but awaiting input from the Auditor.

SOLICITOR

- a. There was no report.

COUNCIL PRESIDENT'S REPORT

- a. No report

MAYOR'S REPORT

- a. The Mayor reviewed the February 2017 West Shore Regional Police Incident Report.
- b. Chief Hope reported that the K-9 officer is working out well and he meets expectations 100%.

PLANNING COMMISSION

- a. There was no report.

BUILDING, PROPERTY & AUXILIARY SERVICE

- a. There was no report.

ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE

a. A Motion by Ms. Stuski, second by Mr. Deklinski: to pay the 2 Payroll checks for 2017 totaling \$410.00. The Motion carried.

A Motion by Ms. Stuski, second by Mrs. Stuart: to pay the 2017 General Fund bills, 28 checks totaling \$50,704.39. The Motion carried.

A Motion by Ms. Stuski, second by Mr. Deklinski: to pay the 2017 Sewer Revenue Fund bills, 17 checks totaling \$72,569.49. The Motion carried.

PARKS, PUBLIC LANDS, RECREATION

a. Ms. Stuski reported that CAPCOG is setting up firefighter training for April 22, 2017. More information will follow.

STREETS, HIGHWAYS, SANITARY AFFAIRS

a. Mr. Deklinski reported that the estimates have come in from the Engineer for the proposed Streets Program. All of them cannot be done with the funds that are available. A Motion by Mr. Deklinski, second by Mrs. Stuart: to approve to bid for paving E. Crestwood Drive and Rupley Road. The Motion carried.

b. The Borough Engineer has been working on the MS4 requirements and has recommended building a swale in Rupley Park and putting some riprap and doing some stream-bank work on the Conodoguinet Creek. A decision on this is due soon. Our MS4 application is due in September, 2017 and then we have five years to finance and do the work.

c. A Motion by Mr. Deklinski, second by Mrs. Stuart: to amend the Snow Emergency Ordinance 506 to delete "six inches (6")" from the ordinance and insert "when emergency is declared." The Motion carried. The signs that have been installed will need to be replaced or altered. The recent snow storm and removal of cars from the streets was hampered by the six inch requirement.

d. The recent snow storm brought attention to the fact that the radios in the trucks are not being kept on when the truck is being used.

e. A Motion by Mr. Stumpf, second by Mr. Deklinski: to advertise for passage of an Ordinance for the financing of the new fire station in Lemoyne up to \$1 Million, as required by Local Government Debt Act in applications to the PA Department of Community and Economic Development. The Motion carried with Ms. Stuski abstaining.

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ZONING & CODES ENFORCEMENT

- a. There was no report.

PUBLIC SAFETY

- a. A Motion by Mr. Stumpf, second by Mr. Deklinski: to accept the West Shore Bureau of Fire Incident Report for February 2017. The Motion carried.
- b. Mr. Deklinski reported that a fire company meeting was held at Dockside Willies to discuss upcoming solicitations for donations to the fire company. They are currently working on a donation list and input on this would be appreciated.

OLD BUSINESS

- a. Mr. Deklinski met with Pastor Rich regarding the parking problems on Locust Street due to the church. Pastor Rich will emphasize appropriate parking to all the members. For Saturday evening and Sunday's after 10:00 a.m. parking can be had at the lot next to the borough building.

NEW BUSINESS

- a. The abandoned property at 122-124 South Front Street was discussed. Mr. Berresford is planning on making application for a grant through the Cumberland County C.D.B.G. or the County Demolition Fund for blighted properties. He is hopeful of approval because Cumberland County has been working with the Borough on this property. The owner has moved to Texas and his whereabouts are unknown.
- b. On Good Friday, the Fire Company is sponsoring a Fish Dinner fund raiser.

Being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 2:26 p.m.
